Free General Legal Advice

We provide FREE 30-minute legal consultations. We can assist with the following issues in family, civil and criminal law.

Family Law

- Domestic violence orders
- Separation/divorce
- Parenting
- Property Settlement

Civil Matters

- Debt/consumer complaints
- Property damage from a motor vehicle accident
- Peace and good behaviour orders
- Consumer complaints

Criminal Law

- Criminal charges
- Breach of domestic violence orders

FREE Mediation Service

Our mediation service helps people solve disputes confidentially, quickly and with as little formality and technicality as possible. Parties may attend mediation by choice or by court order.

BCLS provides co-mediation - two mediators instead of one. During mediation, no lawyers are present.

The mediator has no determinative role but will assist each party to identify issues in dispute, develop options and consider alternatives to reach a mutually acceptable outcome.

Our mediation service can assist clients with:

- Family issues;
- Debt issues;
- Consumer issues; and
- Neighbour disputes.
